**Subject: -Grant of Conditional permission to Om Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Bharat Bharti, Jamthi, Betul-460001, Madhya Pradesh, (AYU0138) for intake capacity with 40 seats in UG (BAMS) Course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24 and issuance of Letter of Permission for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) Course from 40 seats to 60 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2023-24-regarding.**

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM ACT 2020 shall not be applicable.

1. I am to refer to your application vide ref. no. **OHECA/21-22/By Hand/386 dated 06.12.2022**, on the subject cited above and to verify the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff and other facilities available at your college namely **Om Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Bharat Bharti, Jamthi, Betul-460001, Madhya Pradesh (AYU0138) for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 40 seats to 60 seats** from the academic session 2023-24 and Letter of Intent (LoI) has been issued to your college vide letter of **even no. dated 01.05.2023 for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 40 seats to 60 seats** under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 from the academic session 2023-24.
2. Further, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) had carried out an inspection of the college on **29.05.2023 & 30.05.2023 and re-visited on 30.06.2023 & 01.07.2023 through Hybrid mode** to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities available as a part of annual visitation for **issuance of conditional permission for intake capacity with 40 seats in UG (BAMS) Course** under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24 and for **issuance of Letter of Permission (LOP) for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 40 seats to 60 seats** under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 from the academic session 2023-24.
3. Further, in view of above assessment report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely "the Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020. **On examining the same certain deficiencies were observed by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM).**

4. As per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the assessment report was placed in the **52<sup>nd</sup> Board Meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **01.08.2023**. On careful examination of the assessment report Board decided to provide an opportunity of hearing to your college. Thereafter, an opportunity of hearing was granted to your college on **29.08.2023** to present the case through virtual mode.
5. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM has been carefully re-examined in terms of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations there under, **and was once again placed in 57<sup>th</sup> Board Meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) dated 05.09.2023. Board verified the same and found that college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission for intake capacity with 40 seats in UG (BAMS) Course for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and to issue Letter of Permission (LOP) for Increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 40 seats to 60 seats from the academic session 2023-24 under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020.**
6. Further, in accordance of the regulation 6 (3) (j) (i) of "Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019 vide letter of even no. dated **06.09.2023 a letter was sent to you** to furnish fixed security deposit worth **Rupees Twenty Five Lakh Only (Rs. 25,00,000/-)** in favor of National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine for the period of five years. In response of the same you have furnished the fixed security deposit in favor of the National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine through **RTGS/NEFT/UTR. No. IBKLR92023090700079574 dated 07.09.2023 of Rupees Twenty Five Lakh Only (Rs. 25,00,000/-) transferred by IDBI Bank, Betul (for a period of five years) and informed the same vide letter no. OHECA/2023/309-A dated 07.09.2023.**
7. **Therefore, Grant of Conditional Permission is issued to Om Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Bharat Bharti, Jamthi, Betul-460001, Madhya Pradesh, (AYU0138) for intake capacity with 40 seats in UG (BAMS) Course for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and to issue Letter of Permission (LOP) for Increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 40 seats to 60 seats from the academic session 2023-24 under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, subject to the following conditions:**
  - I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
  - II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the **permitted intake capacity of 60 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
  - III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
9. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
10. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

11. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2023 and send a compliance report to get permission for the session 2024-25:-
- all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
  - The applicant shall fulfill all the relevant provisions of Regulations namely the "Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019.
  - all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
  - all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto; and
12. This permission to increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 40 to 60 seats from the academic session 2023-24 as stated above for the first admitted batch of 2023-24 session, will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against these courses appear for the first final examination of the said courses and at that time, the College authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications under Section 35 of the NCISM Act 2020.
13. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission from the academic session 2024-25.
